UK\_Indonesia Creative Exchange Programme - Abandon Normal Devices Festival 2020

# Abandon Normal Devices and British Council Indonesia are delighted to launch an open call for a creative exchange opportunity for an Indonesia-based curator, arts manager or creative producer.

## ABOUT THE OPPORTUNITY

Abandon Normal Devices and British Council Indonesia invite applications for a creative exchange opportunity for an Indonesian based curator/arts manager/creative producer. This will be an opportunity to work with Abandon Normal Devices during the development and delivery of AND Festival in May 2020. Supported by the AND team, the selected candidate will collaborate to curate/produce activity as part of the festival programme that responds to our site and themes. At this time, we see this sitting within the LIVE strand of the festival - film, music and immersive storytelling and technology showcase, however this is flexible depending on the selected candidate and development of the programme.

The opportunity will involve two visits to the UK, in Febuary 2020 in the lead up to the festival and in May 2020 during the festival.

#### AND Festival:

Abandon Normal Devices (AND) Festival is the UK's only roaming biennial digital festival, interdisciplinary and pioneering in the physical and digital realm. In 2020, Inspired by the industrial heritage and landscape that connects Manchester and Liverpool, AND Festival will take to the water, exploring this global trade gateway via the Manchester Ship Canal and River Mersey.

These immense infrastructures built around the rivers and canals chronicle our past, present and future industries. Products from oil refineries; recycling plants; shipping container terminals; wind farms and agriculture, flow from the water banks to sites across the region and globe. The waterways will be a site to explore urgent conversations relating to women and climate change, rising sea levels, maritime borders and global trade, in connection to emerging science, technology and changing political structures.

AND will curate a programme of audience experiences which will take place quayside in Liverpool and the Wirral, and on the waters of the River Mersey and along the Manchester Ship Canal -- inviting artists and audiences to become navigators of future territories exploring water, land and air.

The programme will consist of immersive installations, public realm works, augmented reality seascapes, virtual environments, floating experiments, immersive field trips, and film events; featuring a mix of art forms to create rich audience experiences that are connected to the area and its ecology, geology and industrial heritage.

#### Location:

The AND Festival takes place in various locations across Merseyside and Cheshire with a festival hub located in Liverpool. The majority of the placement will take place in Liverpool with time spent working in the AND office in Manchester and a production base in Liverpool in the run up to the festival when in the UK.

The exchange will involve remote working (meetings over Skype) whilst in Indonesia and travel to the UK in February 2020 and May 2020.

This opportunity will run in collaboration with Kazimier who will be hosting a parallel creative exchange. Based in Liverpool, Kazimier create interdisciplinary multimedia shows for a variety of contexts from intimate theatre to mass audience outdoor spectacles. Kazimier will manage and host this parallel exchange at their Liverpool based venue Invisible Wind Factory. The two exchange opportunities will be able to benefit from drawing from both organisations' networks; the artists, curators, producers in the wider AND network as well as networks specifically within Liverpool where they will be based for the duration of their time in the UK. The two creative exchange participants will share accommodation and use The Invisible Wind Factory as a base for working when in Liverpool, as well as time spent in Manchester at the AND office.

The programme timeline allows crossover for both creative exchange participants at key points in the project, specifically times when they are both hosted in the UK. (See the timeline below for the schedule).

Whilst running in parallel there is potential for activity crossover with the Kazimier and AND as part of AND Festival, and we will continue to discuss potential for this crossover as our respective programmes develop over the coming months.

- Networking opportunities with AND's wider network of artists, producers and arts organisations in the North West and nationally.
- Visa for travel to the UK. AND and British Council will support the visa application process and cover cost.

#### ELIGIBILITY/PERSON SPECIFICATION

- This call is open to individuals working as a curator/arts manager/creative producer in Indonesia
- Must have some experience of curating/producing projects although they will be supported by the AND team in the development and presentation at the festival
- Experience / interest / understanding of digital culture/creative technology (new media art) and creative media trends
- Have a good command of spoken and written English. The working language across the programme is English and interpretation will not be provided.
- Use of own laptop and phone
- Be independent, curious and collaborative
- Applicants must be available to participate in all stages of the programme as stated in the timeline.

#### HOW TO APPLY

**Deadline for applications is Midnight Sunday 1**st **December 2019 (Jakarta time)** all applications will be reviewed by a panel consisting of representatives from AND and British Council Indonesia. Shortlisted candidates will be invited for a skype interview **w/b 9th December.** 

All applications to be completed in English.

Abandon Normal Devices (AND) is a catalyst for new approaches to art-making, creative intervention and cultural deviance, commissioning groundbreaking projects that challenge the definitions of art, digital culture and moving image.

The AND portfolio consists of film happenings, exhibitions, performances, online projects, residencies, public realm interventions and the UK's only roaming digital biennial festival. We support projects that foster a richer and more critical digital culture by creating a space for artists and organisations to create radical, risk-taking work that pushes the boundaries of audience experience and arts production. Bringing together an eclectic mix of artists, academics, filmmakers, technologist, scientists and anarchists to develop projects which abandon traditional settings and partnerships.

AND is a place where artists together with audiences can push the boundaries of contemporary art and debate what is normal in our culture and society. Criticality and participation are central to the artistic programme, and audiences recognise AND as a place they can find new artforms, discover artists and encounter emerging trends.
