WELCOME TO WETLAB!

- The WetLab lives on floating modular pontoons and therefore it moves with the water. Please ensure to follow the artist guidance on where to walk (as we have to maintain a good weight balance on the structure)
- Max capacity is 10 people
- The rocket stove on the left can become very hot. Please be mindful of this and don't touch the stove or the structure supporting it. Where possible maintain 1m distance from the stove at all times.
- If there is strong wind, please check with the artists if you are allowed to board the lab
- Children must be accompanied at all times
Particular care should be taken near the stove and near the handrail
- If you are joining a workshop, please wear a mask and sanitize your hands when boarding.
Where possible, maintain 1m distance from other visitors or participants on the structure
